1 ARCHIVE OF THE 1963-5 EXCAVATIONS

The surviving archive of the 1963–5 excavations comprises:

- 32 drawings on tracing paper and paper (one of which is a dyeline). These are mostly on-site drawings of sections and plans but some are composite and represent a stage in working up the material for publication. The dyeline is of an inked-up version of the plan of the villa. Another small plan of the villa showing proposed phases is also inked ready for publication.
- Two notebooks (code 28-321-Supplied for the public service). One book is entitled 'Fullerton 1963 site book'; the second is entitled 'Fullerton 1964 Site Book. Also 1965 trench notes: see also 1965 site book etc. (from p. 55)'. No site book for 1965 exists.
- Two 6 inch to 1 mile maps of the region, one the 1961 edition, the other a photocopy of part of an earlier (undated) edition.

There also exist four typescripts:

This consists of a typescript of 40 numbered pages offering a description of the excavated features (pp. 1–32), the artefacts (no text, heading only) (p. 33), discussion (pp. 34–7), bibliography (pp. 38–40). There is also a separate typescript, *Context record: Fullerton (Wherwell) Archive list* fully listing the archaeological contexts (46 pp.) and a separate 2 pp. list entitled *Fullerton Villa: list of features*.

This compilation was intended to form the basis of the publication of the 1963–5 excavations. It contains much useful detail but there are many discrepancies and inconsistencies which result from the sparseness of the original record. These have been corrected insofar as possible by the excavations of 2000–01. The typescript has been superseded by the present volume. No finds report has been located.
